
Starting Points

Page Tools

This site includes a floating navigation bar displaying four **page tools** — buttons to help you work efficiently with each page.

Desktop Version

The desktop version’s page tools appear in a black floating navigation bar accessible anywhere on the page. The tools are:

- **Show Page/Edit Page** — Depending on whether you’re a registered author, this button either allows you to see the page source code or edit the article.
- **Old Revisions** — Peruse the article’s edit history.
- **Backlinks** — See what other articles on the site link back to the one you’re currently reading.
- **Back to Top** — Takes you back to the top of the article.

Mobile Version

The responsive version of the site in mobile browsers hides the page tools in the collapsed navigation bar you can access at the top left of each page by tapping on the triangular blue + icon.

The **info box** highlights important information. We use it most often to easily distinguish between objective facts we document and informed opinion or speculation we believe helps readers better understand what's at stake in the case.



Tips

The **tip box** typically holds helpful information to assist readers with a specific action.



Alert Box

The **alert box** imparts information intended to help readers avoid trouble.



Important

This box highlights important information for readers who may have a direct stake in the case. We use it most often to target information for a specific audience, such as people who donated to the production of *Axanar*, through one of its [crowdfunding campaigns](#) or through direct donation on the [Axanar website](#).
